This fall, EFBA (French Education for the Bay Area) is offering beginning (“Anglophone”) afterschool French classes at Korematsu Middle School for 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders (6<sup>th</sup> graders will be also considered). The class will meet twice a week, starting in late September, through May, 2016. The timing will be 3:30-5pm.

This is a great opportunity – the class is challenging and fun, with hands-on activities, plays, and group projects. For kids who take band or drama as an elective, but also want to learn a language, it is a way to fit everything in.
